> Adopted 1989 signed by 193 countries (except Somalia, South Sudan, and USA)

- Article 3 Best interests
- Article 6 Right to survival and development
- Article 12 Right to be listened to

International Children's Palliative Care Network Charter of Rights for life-limited and life-threatened children

The charter sets out the international standard of support, that is the right of all children living with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions and their families

Palliative Care Rights Include:

- Pain relief
- Symptom control for physical and psychological symptoms
- Essential medicines for palliative care
- Spiritual and bereavement care
- Family centered care
- Care by trained palliative care professionals

Pediatric Palliative Care

- Worldwide there are 7-9 million children with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions requiring palliative care.
- 80% live in resource-limited countries.
- The estimated global number of children in need of palliative care at the end-of-life is almost 1,2 million.
- The rights of these dying children are often unrecognized and hence not respected.
